SEATTLE MANDARIN CONGREGATION

- Following the baptism of seven brothers and sisters during the summer, we give thanks to God that five more were baptized during the Christmas season! Praise the Lord for using the brothers and sisters of the Seattle Mandarin Congregation to bear witness for Him and to proclaim the gospel widely. May all glory be to God!
- Praise God for the Christmas Eve Candlelight Music Service and the special Christmas Sunday worship. May the Lord remember the dedicated preparations of Sister Lydia Huang and the Mandarin Choir. Through them, God granted special comfort, encouragement, and blessings.
- We thank God for the successful theological seminar held in January on the theme "Exploring the Charismatic Movement." In response to the many questions and differing perspectives among the congregation regarding the Charismatic Movement, the Mandarin elders decided to equip the congregation through a theological seminar—grounded in biblical principles and the doctrine of the Holy Spirit—so that believers may develop a balanced, God-pleasing perspective and live out the power of the Holy Spirit.
- After seven consecutive years of service, two of our elders began their sabbatical this month; at the same time, two additional brothers have been selected as new ruling elders. The chairmanship of the Ministry Council has also recently transitioned, and another brother has become a new deacon. May the Lord keep these leadership transitions smooth and use this current team to lead the Mandarin Congregation well.
- Please pray for the various fellowships as they prepare special Lunar New Year gatherings. May the Lord use these celebrations to unite the body in love and, through inviting new friends, spread the gospel.
- Please also pray for families who have

lost loved ones, for brothers and sisters who are physically weak or undergoing medical treatment, and for those who are seeking employment. May God grant comfort, healing, provision, and sufficient grace for each one.

PRAY FOR OUR MISSIONARIES

Rev. Low (Boonprasert Vijittrakul) and Boon Har are local Thai missionaries and active church planters in Northern Thailand. Their community outreach programs include drug rehabilitation, a boarding school for displaced or orphaned children, and a community outreach center. In Nov, they celebrated 53 baptisms across five locations! After attending a conference in Singapore, they were encouraged by the 5,000-member church with an average age of 23! This church has managed to stay young and strong for the past 20+ years, and their church has been picked, amongst three in Chiangmai, to receive guidance on building a young and strong church. In their 60's and 70's, they're starting something new. They ask for prayers for the following: May those baptized experience God's power and love, and for them to be a channel of blessing to their community. May the Lord bring more workers, establish more churches in more districts, and use English lessons in their community to reach young people.

- Please pray for those who have been impacted by the winter storm throughout much of the US this week. May the Lord protect those who must work in the frigid cold and be gracious to those most vulnerable, that they may find warm shelter.
