What a powerful illustration from Sunday's message: the stark contrast between the one-mile world record and the 4x400 relay. Hicham El Guerrouj's astonishing mile record from July 7, 1999, still stands as one of the greatest individual athletic achievements. And yet, as remarkable as his solo effort was, he would fall far behind if he competed against the US 4x400 relay team working together. Honestly, he might even lose to the middle-school relay teams I watched at my daughter's track meet last year.

What a reminder from the Spirit that our efforts in outreach are meant to be shared efforts, not solo events. Paul captures this beautifully in Philippians 1:27,

"Let your manner of life be worthy of the gospel of Christ.. standing firm in one spirit, with one mind striving side by side for the faith of the gospel."

As you reflect this week, consider how God might be calling you to **PARTNER** with others in our church family by doing a few of the following:
